

It is ORDERED that KENNETH PETERS make due return, showing execution of same.



SALES TAX REBATE AGREEMENT

This Sales Tax Rebate Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Buc-ee's, Ltd. (the "Company") and the County of Hunt, Texas (the "County")

Recitals:

Whereas, the Company desires to locate in the County.

Whereas, pursuant to §381.004(g) of the Texas Local Government Code, the County Commissioners of Hunt may develop and administer a program to stimulate business and commercial activity in Hunt County, Texas by entering into an agreement to refund sales tax with an owner of a property interest subject to ad valorem taxation in Hunt County, Texas for a period of not more than ten (10) years.

Whereas, the Company shall construct a travel center facility at the Travel Center Facility, as defined herein below.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the mutual benefits and promises contained herein, which shall include the improvement by Company of a portion of the real property wherein the Travel Center Facility is to be located, as defined herein below.

Article One Authorization

This Agreement is authorized by §381.004 et seq. of the Texas Local Government Code.

Article Two Definitions

Site Specific Sales Tax Revenue: means that portion of taxable purchases and sales consummated by the Company's Travel Center Facility in Hunt County, Texas. A sale of a taxable item is consummated as provided in Tex. Tax Code Ann. 321.203.

Travel Center Facility: means the place of business of the retailer (the Company) in Hunt County, Texas, as defined in Tex. Tax Code Ann. 321.002(3).

Program: means the economic development program pursuant to Local Government Code Chapter 381.

Program Payment: means the amount paid by the County to the Company each month under the Program.

Sales Tax Revenues: means the amount of total sales tax received by the County as a direct result of purchases and sales through the Travel Center Facility.

Article Three Term

The term of this Agreement is herein defined as a ten (10) year period, beginning on the date the Company's Travel Center Facility is substantially complete and business operations have commenced (the "Term").

Article Four Sales Tax Refund Proposal

During the Term of this Agreement, the County of Hunt shall refund to the Company fifty percent (50%) of the Sales Tax Revenues.

Article Five Submission of Data

Within 30 days from the end of each calendar month, the Company shall submit to the County a schedule detailing the Site Specific Sales Tax Revenues for that month (the "Schedule"). As backup for the Schedule, the Company shall submit the following:

- (a) a copy of all sales tax reports, including amended reports, filed by the Company for that month showing sales tax collected;
- (b) a copy of all direct payment and self-assessment returns, including amended returns, filed by the Company (for the Travel Center Facility) for that month showing sales/use tax paid; and
- (c) information concerning any refund received by the Company of sales tax paid by the Company (for the Travel Center Facility) for sales tax collected.

The Company shall certify in writing on or before the 30th day from the anniversary of this Agreement that the Company is in compliance with each applicable term of this Agreement.

Article Six Program Payment

Within 30 days of receipt of sales tax revenues from the State of Texas for the month covered by a Schedule submitted by the Company pursuant to Article Five, the County shall pay the Program Payment to the Company or as directed in writing by the Company.

Article Seven Computation of Program Payment

The Program Payment for the month shall be the sum of twenty five percent (25%) of the Sales Tax Revenues, which is equal to 50% of Hunt County's \$.005 tax rate. This payment is computed based on Site Specific Sales Tax Revenues. If during the Term of this Agreement, state law applicable to county taxation changes, and, as a result, the Program Payment amount differs materially from the amount which would have been calculated if state law remained the same as in effect on the date of this Agreement, then the parties shall endeavor to adjust the Program. Payment computation so as to achieve the same proportionate economic benefits to both parties as would resulted if the law had not changed.

Article Eight Default

If either party should default (herein called the "Defaulting Party") with respect to any of its obligations hereunder and should fail, within thirty (30) days after delivery of written notice of such default from the other party (herein called the "Complaining Party") to cure such defaults, the Complaining Party, by action or proceeding at law or in equity, may be awarded its damages. Any Program Payment from the County to the Company required hereunder which is not timely paid by the County shall incur interest at the current rate applied to the County's General Fund Balance at the County Depository at the time of default. The interest shall accrue from the date such Program Payment is due until paid.

Article Nine Article Mutual Assistance

The County and the Company shall do all things necessary or appropriate to carry out the terms and provisions of this Agreement and to aid and assist each other in carrying out such terms and provisions. Company hereby consents to and agrees to cooperate in any reasonable request by the County to obtain copies of Sales/Use tax returns from the State, which contains information pertinent to the calculation of a Program Payment.

Article Ten Representations and Warranties

The County represents and warrants to the Company that the Program and this Agreement are within the scope of its authority and it is duly authorized and empowered to establish the Program and enter into this Agreement. The Company represents and warrants to the County that it has the requisite authority to enter into this Agreement.

Article Eleven Amendment and Cancellation

This Agreement may only be amended or altered by written instrument signed by all parties. The County may cancel or modify this Agreement if the Company fails to comply with this Agreement. If the *Travel Center Facility* is not completed and in full operation by four (4) years from the date this Agreement is approved by the County, the Agreement will become null and void.

Article Twelve Assignments

This Agreement may not be assigned by the Company without prior written approval of the County, such approval not to be unreasonably withheld, conditioned or delayed. Should this Agreement be assigned with permission of the County, it will be binding on and inure to the benefit of the parties, their respective successors and assigns.

Article Thirteen Severability

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) requires reporting pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Sections 6055 and 6056 beginning in January 2016 for calendar year 2015. All employers with 50 or more full-time equivalent employees are affected. This reporting will consist of forms which must be provided both to employees and the IRS. The information provided will be used to determine: 1) whether individuals are subject to fines under the ACA individual mandate; 2) whether individuals are eligible for a federal premium subsidy or tax credit; and 3) whether employers are subject to penalties under the ACA employer mandate.

The Texas Association of Counties Health and Employee Benefits Pool (TAC HEBP) is offering the Affordable Care Act Reporting and Tracking Service (ARTS) which will enable you to produce your section 6055/6056 forms. ARTS will also provide measurement period tracking for 2016 and beyond, as well as affordability testing for groups who require employee contributions toward the cost of their own health coverage.

TAC will need to receive employee, payroll, and unpaid leave of absence files from you in order to provide this service. BANK DEPOSITORY AGREEMENT

#13,452

This BANK Depository Agreement (the "Agreement") is made and entered into this 1st day of June, 2015 by and between Hunt County, located at 2507 Lee Street, Greenville, Texas, 75403 (the "COUNTY") and American National Bank of Texas, located at 5809 Wesley Street, Greenville, Texas 75402 (the "BANK") a national BANK.

Section I Designation as Depository

The COUNTY, through action of its Governing Body, hereby designates the BANK as its depository for banking services for a four (4) year period commencing June 1, 2015 through April 30, 2019. The contract shall allow for one (1) possible two year extension, through April 30, 2021.

If a timed deposit maturity extends beyond the expiration date of the contract, the depository bank will pledge sufficient securities required for public funds to COUNTY to provide for the maturity of the time deposit.

Section II Designation of Custodian

The COUNTY and BANK hereby designate FHLB-Dallas (the "Custodian") to hold in trust, according to the terms and conditions of the COUNTY's Request for Proposal, RFP # 128-15 dated March 13, 2015, (the "RFP") and pursuant to a separate Safekeeping Agreement, all securities pledged as depository collateral in accordance with the COUNTY's Investment Policy.

Any and all fees from the Custodian associated with the safekeeping of securities pledged to the benefit of the COUNTY shall be borne by the BANK.

Section III Collateral

COUNTY time and demand deposits, inclusive of interest, in excess of the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation insurance shall be secured at all times by collateral, acceptable to the COUNTY and in accordance with the Public Funds Collateral Act (Texas Government Code 2257), pledged by the Bank and held in trust by the Custodian in an amount equal to at least 102% of the total of those funds. Custodian will provide a monthly report of the collateral directly to the COUNTY.

Such pledged securities shall be subject only to the joint written instructions of both (a) authorized representatives of the COUNTY and (b) specifically authorized representatives of the BANK. The BANK shall have the right, with the prior written consent of the COUNTY, to substitute or replace, any or all of the pledged securities with collateral acceptable to the COUNTY.

Section IV Financial Position

The BANK will provide financial statements audited by its independent auditors including a letter as to its "fair representation," upon request by COUNTY.

Section V Authorized COUNTY Representative

For the term of this contract, the COUNTY designates the individuals as listed in the Treasury Management Resolution as authorized to represent and act for the COUNTY in any and all matters including collateral assignment and substitution, execution of agreements and transfer of funds. Any change in these representatives will be made in writing.

Section VI Scope of Services

The BANK's response to the COUNTY's RFP, dated April 10, 2015, (the "Response") is incorporated into this Agreement for all purposes, including service charges, time deposit, demand deposit and loan rates (subject to the special note below). If any provisions of the Response and this Agreement are in conflict, this Agreement will control.

BANK DEPOSITORY AGREEMENT

The BANK shall faithfully perform all of its duties and obligations required by the laws of the State of Texas for public funds depositories and shall upon presentation pay all checks drawn on it against collected funds on demand deposits, and shall, at the expiration of the Agreement, turn over to its successor all funds, COUNTY -owned securities, property and things of value held as depository.

The COUNTY shall have the power to determine and designate the character and amount of the funds to be deposited in the BANK. The COUNTY may arrange for time deposits and BANK may accept such deposits subject to the terms of the BANK's Response.

This Agreement, along with all Exhibits and other incorporated documents shall constitute the entire Agreement between the parties.

Section VII Bank Compensation

BANK will be compensated for any and all services rendered to COUNTY under this Agreement (subject to the special note below). Unless otherwise noted, any non-interest bearing balances shall receive an earnings credit rate to offset analysis fees. Interest bearing balances shall receive an interest rate at current bank rates, unless otherwise noted (see special note below).

Special note: COUNTY shall receive an Earnings Credit Rate ("ECR") of 0.25% based on the total average monthly collected non-interested bearing balances on account.

In addition, BANK will pay a rate equal to the current Public Fund Money Market Rate of 0.05% plus 0.10% for a total of 0.15%, per annum, on all interest-bearing demand deposit accounts or business money market accounts. The ANBTX Public Fund Money Market rate (currently 0.05%) is subject to change from time to time to reflect current market rates. However, it is guaranteed to go no lower during the contract period.

Section VIII Default

The BANK shall be in default if it fails to pay all or part of a demand deposit, a matured time deposit, or a matured certificate of deposit, including accrued but unpaid interest, at a specified maturity date. The BANK shall also be in default if ruled "bankrupt", "insolvent" or "failed" by a federal or state banking regulator, or if a receiver is appointed for the BANK.

In the event of a default, failure or insolvency of the BANK, the COUNTY shall be deemed to have vested full title to all securities pledged under this Agreement. The COUNTY is empowered to take possession of and transfer and or sell any and all securities. If the security is liquidated, any proceeds over the defaulted amount, plus expenses related to liquidation, shall be returned to the Bank. This power is in addition to other remedies which the COUNTY may have under this Agreement and without prejudice to its rights to maintain any suit in any court for redress of injuries sustained by the COUNTY under this Agreement.

Section IX Non-Assignability

This Agreement is not assignable in whole or in part but is binding on the parties, their successors and assigns.

Section X Termination

This Agreement may be terminated by either the COUNTY or the BANK by giving sixty (60) days prior written notice to the parties.

BANK DEPOSITORY AGREEMENT

Section XI Law Governing

All applicable provisions and requirements of the laws of the State of Texas governing depositories for the COUNTY shall be a part of this Agreement.

Section XII Bank Authorization

The BANK represents and warrants that this Agreement is made pursuant to and is duly authorized by the Board of Directors of the BANK and recorded in the official records of the BANK.

CITY-COUNTY PLAT APPROVAL AGREEMENT

That this Agreement is entered into by and between the County of Hunt, Texas ("County") and the City of Josephine, Texas ("City"), in accordance with the provisions of House Bill 1445 ("H.B.1445"), enacted by the 77th Legislature of the State of Texas, and is to witness the following:

WHEREAS, County is a county operating under Sections 232.001-232.005 of the Local Government Code; and,

WHEREAS, County does not contain extraterritorial jurisdiction of a municipality with a population of 1.9 million or more, is not within fifty miles of an international border, and is not subject to Subchapter C, Chapter 232; and,

WHEREAS, City is a general law city whose extraterritorial jurisdiction ("ETJ") is partially in Hunt County, Texas, and has ETJ as a matter of law under the provisions of Chapter 42, Local Government Code, which ETJ has been expanded by petition of landowners; and,

WHEREAS, House Bill 1445, effective September 1, 2001, Chapter 242, Local Government Code, was amended to require City and County to enter into an agreement that identifies the governmental entity authorized to regulate subdivision plats and approve related permits in the ETJ of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises and considerations herein expressed, the receipt and sufficiency of which are hereby acknowledged by the parties, the parties hereto agree as follows:

- City Granted Jurisdiction. The parties agree that City shall be granted exclusive 1. jurisdiction to regulate all subdivision plats and approve all related permits except for septic permits in the ETJ of the City in accordance with the Local Government Code, its adopted subdivision regulations or other applicable rules and regulations.
- 2. One Office for Plat Applications, Fee Payments and Responses. Pursuant to this Agreement, the City Hall of the City is authorized to accept plat applications for tracts of land located in the ETJ of the City, to collect plat application fees established by law, and provide applicants one response indicating approval or denial of the plat application by the appropriate approving authority.
- 3. Areas Outside ETJ. In an unincorporated area outside the ETJ of the City, the City may not regulate subdivisions or approve the filing of plats, and the County

retains jurisdiction to do so. Should the City expand or reduce its ETJ, City shall promptly notify County of such expansion or reduction. City and County agree that such an expansion or reduction shall not require amendment of this Agreement, and the City shall continue to be granted exclusive jurisdiction to regulate subdivision plats and approve related permits in the City's ETJ as expanded or reduced, and the County shall continue to have jurisdiction of areas outside the City's ETJ.

- 4. Costs. All costs involved with the City's approval of subdivision plats under this Agreement shall be borne by the City and payable out of current revenues available to it.
- 5. Periodic Review. This Agreement may be reviewed periodically and revised to address changed circumstances. This Agreement may only be modified or amended by a subsequent Agreement in writing between the same parties.

Miscellaneous Provisions.

- 6. This Agreement shall not constitute an Agreement for the provision of governmental functions or services by either party for the other, except for the specific subject matter hereof.
- 7. All notices required to be given by virtue of this Agreement shall be addressed as follows and delivered by certified mail, postage prepaid, or by hand delivery:

County of Hunt ATTN: County Judge Hunt County Courthouse Greenville, Texas

City of Josephine ATTN: Mayor 108 W. Hubbard Road Josephine, Texas 75164

- 8. In the event any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, phrase or word of this Agreement shall be held invalid, illegal or unconstitutional, the balance of the Agreement shall be severable, and shall be enforced as if the parties intended to delete the invalid portion.
- 9. This Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any action under this Agreement shall be the State District Court of Hunt County, Texas. This Agreement is performable in Hunt County, Texas.
- 10. This Agreement may be executed in identical counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original and constitute one and the same instrument.

- 11. This Agreement embodies the complete agreement of the parties hereto, superseding all prior or contemporaneous, oral or written agreements between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof.
- 12. All Recitals contained in this Agreement are incorporated herein by reference for all purposes and specifically found to be true and correct by the parties hereto.
- 13. The undersigned officers of the parties hereto have been duly authorized by appropriate legislative action of their respective governing bodies to execute this Agreement and bind the represented party to the terms hereof.
- 14. This Agreement is not intended to and does not extend the liability of the parties beyond that provided by law. Neither the City nor the County waives any immunity or defense that would otherwise be available to it against claims by third parties.
- 15. All rights, orders, approvals, permits, and legal or administrative proceedings, with regard to a subdivision plat of property in the ETJ of the City in existence at the effective date of this Agreement shall continue until consummation
