As a way to further impact youth, our Reecy Davis Club has begun to run Virtual Learning Academies- all-day programming for youth during days that the School District is closed!

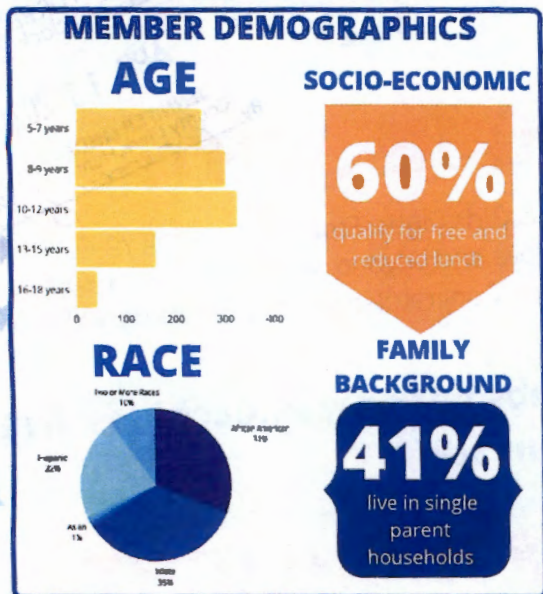


THANK YOU
